Weather Wednesday: High 68, low 56, rain .16; Thursday high 61, low 32 . . . President Harry Truman took the oath of office as President on Thursday noon. Chief Justice Fred Vinson administered the oath. Senator Barkley became Vice-president. One million people were in Washington for the ceremonies. Truman is the first Democratic Vice-president to become President in over 100 years, since John Tyler succeeded William Henry Harrison at his death in 1841. Truman is the first Democratic Vice-president to be elected President since Martin Van Buren who was inaugurated in 1837 to succeed Andrew Jackson, who had completed two terms. Franklin D. Roosevelt was the only Democratic President to die in office and he was on his fourth term, something unusual. . . In his inaugural speech Truman urged support of the United Nations Aid for world economic recovery, higher world standard, and a crusade against Communism. . . In the meantime Tryon and Polk County are busy with many activities. . .
