Mrs. D. C. Brundage, chairman of the committee for Pearson's Falls, read a letter from Donald Peattie, written from France y ago, when an earlier club was calcidering the purchase of the tract. Mr. Peattie wrote that the vegetation there is unique, that there are 240 varieties of plants and flowers, and many mosses, algae, etc. He stated that there is nothing else like the glen in this general region, including Mt Mitchell, and that certain plant species were first discovered there.
