Dr. W. L. Norville, District Health Officer for the Rutherford-Polk District Health Department said today that a Maternal and Infant Clinic will be opened this week at the Green Creek School in Polk County. The first meeting will be on Wednesday, July 19, and the clinic will be open each first, second and third Wednesday thereafter. The hours of the clinic are from 9 a. m. to 4 p. m., each week. Dr. W. T. Head practicing physician of Melvin Hill, will be clinician and Mrs. Gladys Hinsdale will be clinic nurse.

The services offered by the clinic will be immunization for diphtheria, whooping cough, smallpox and typhoid fever; blood tests; pre-natal and post-natal examinations; regular monthly examinations; regular monthly examinations of babies up to one year of age and annual examinations of pre-school children up to six years of age.

Leon Moore White, 42, of Knoxville, Tenn., formerly of Tryon, died suddenly Sunday afternoon in Knoxville where he was employed as a civil engineer.

Funeral services were to be conducted today noon at Bass Funeral home in Rock Hill, S. C., followed by interment in Laurelwood Cemetery.

Mr. White was a son of Mrs. Eva Moore White and the late Hugh White. Both formerly lived in Tryon in a home they built on Lake Lanier. Mrs. White taught the 6th grade here for many years.

The deceased was a graduate of Clemson College and served with the engineering corps in World War 2. He is survived by his wife, two sons, his mother and three brothers.
