**CHARGE 9 LANDRUM MEN WITH MURDER**

Nine Landrum men were charged with the murder of Elmer Wyatt Jr., following an inquest Wednesday night at Landrum.

Rural Police Chief George Pruette said Dean Nodine, 18, admitted firing the fatal pistol blast Tuesday night. Coroner George L. Adams issued murder warrants for 9 men who were present at the killing after the inquest jury recommended they be held for further investigation.

Chief Pruette said testimony at the hearing brought out that the group decided to meet outside of Landrum Tuesday night to settle an argument. Officers said one gun was taken from Nodine and another found on Wyatt.

Men charged remained in County Jail Wednesday night. They are: George Whitesides, 20, Billy Whitesides, 19, Earl Dill, 23, John B. Kelly, 23, T. W. Dill Jr., 21, Jimmy C. Raines, 19, Clyde Raines, 15, T. E. Bridgeman, 19, and Nodine.

Wyatt, 23, was an Air Force veteran from Landrum.

Funeral services for Wyatt will be held this afternoon (Thursday) at 3 at Jackson Grove Methodist Church. The Rev. N. K. Polk will officiate. Burial in the church cemetery.
