The citizens of Tryon lived through a change of administration for three hours Monday from 2 to 5 p. m., when the Boy Scouts took over the operation of the town after being sworn in by Mayor C. D. Stevens. The regular officials report the Scouts did a good job and learned a lot about the operation of municipal affairs. Scout Mayor Lynwood Thompson reported the reign very successful from his standpoint; that the Scouts inspected the water works, sanitary system; inspected the town for fire hazards, display of business licenses, parking conditions, and fined one prominent person for parking opposite a fire hydrant. The street department found a mudhole opposite the American Legion building and put in a load of sand, but Mayor Thompson said they were not in office long enough to finish the job and that it should be fixed before the next rain. Town Manager Ambrose Mills was kept busy answering complaints about many things lacking in the community. The program was very educational for the boys who in a few years
