A large parking lot in the rear permits customers to buy their groceries and be checked out on a separate cash register at the rear entrance without having to go to the front door traffic jam. The building is well-lighted and large letters indicate the various departments such as "Fresh Fruits" and "Vegetables," "Frozen Foods," "Poultry and Meat," "Self Service Meats," "Canned Vegetables", etc., make it easy for customers to find what they want . . .
