Tryon Baptist Minister Resigned On Sunday

Dr. C. E. Scarborough, pastor of the Tryon First Baptist Church, resigned Sunday morning at a business conference of the church members. No statement was made as to Dr. Scarborough's future plans.

A spokesman for the church stated that since Dr. Scarborough came to Tryon as pastor on July 1, 1947, the church had shown unusual growth in all its organizations; and that 170 new members had been added to the church roll. Gifts to missions and welfare work have increased and more than \$20,000 given to the church building fund. Improvements have been made to the church property including a large parking lot in the rear of the church.

Dr. Scarborough is a member of the Rotary Club and is president of the Interracial Ministerial Council.
