## EUGENE GOSNELL DIES FROM AUTO ACCIDENT

Eugene Gosnell, 14-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Chester Gosnell of Tryon Route 1, died this morning at 1:50 at St. Luke's Hospital as the result of injuries received when the automobile in which he was driving turned over on the Greenville road between the residences of Robert Carruth and A. B. Waldrop about 11 o'clock Wednesday night.

Young Gosnell was returning home when the accident happened.

Funeral services will be held Friday afternoon at 2:30 at the Tryon First Baptist Church with the Rev. C. E. Scarborough and the Rev. B. G. Henry officiating. Burial in Tryon cemetery. The body will be at McFarland's Funeral Home in Tryon until 1:15 p. m. Friday.

The deceased was graduated from the Tryon school 8th grade this month and would have entered high school this fall. He is survived by his parents; one brother, Gerald; his paternal grandfather, Marion Gosnell of Landrum Route 2; his maternal grandparents, Rev. and Mrs. W. Broadus Belue of Landrum Route 2.
