## ABC BOARD NAMED

The Tryon Town Commissioners Wednesday night named R. E. Brantley, Elbert H. Arledge and P. L. Bannette as members of the Alcoholic Beverage Control commission. R. E. Brantley was appointed chairman. The ABC commission will have complete local control over the location and operation of the liquor store to be opened in Tryon soon under state law.

The Town Commissioners have no control over the store, according to Mayor C. D. Stevent, except to name the members of the ABC board and set the salaries. As soon as the new board is organized the members will be trained in their duties by the Mecklenburg board and each employee thoroughly trained in his duties.

Mayor Stevens stated that the Town Council fixed the salary of the chairman at \$3,000 per year. He will give full time. The salary of his advisory members will be \$600 each.
