TIGERS WIN 13 TO 0

The Tryon High Tigers, cheered on by a large home-coming crowd turned in an upset win Friday afternoon at Harmon Field. Their opponent, Blacksburg, S. C., was a favorite to win their fifth game in seven starts, but two quick touchdowns and three defensive stands gave the Tigers their first victory of the season.

Coach Prince's charges, strengthened by the return of back Robert Lewellyn took the opening kickoff and drove 60 yards with the running of Lewellyn and Arledge leading. Arledge, hampered by a bad ankle came out on the second play of the game, after picking up 15 yards, and watched Lewellyn score from the 3 yard line. The extra point was short and the Tigers led 6 to 0.

Vicious line play was featured in the third and final quarters as Blacksburg moved again to the Tryon 20. This drive was stopped when center Wiley White made a diving catch of a Blacksburg pass.

The Tigers second score came in the fourth quarter. On the old sleeper play, from their own 30, Lewellyn took a pass from Thomas Arledge and outraced the Blacksburg safety man 70 yards to score. Arledge split the uprights in the extra point attempt.
