The deceased is survived by one daughter, Mrs. W. M. (Katharine) Spivey and two grandchildren, Mary Ella and Billie Banks Spivey; also five sisters, Mrs. Eunice Stockard Watson of Tryon; Mrs. J. B. Mrs. Jones before her marriage was Miss Mary Ella Roberson of Hyde County, N. C. She and her husband came to Saluda about 1912 and moved to Tryon about 1921 to make their home.
