... Eisenhower's big write-in vote in Minnesota stimulates his backers. Senator Clyde Hoey was presented a citation Wednesday night at a meeting of the North Carolina Citizens Association in Raleigh in recognition of his services to the State. The award was made by Senator Willis Smith. Hoey made the principal address on the importance of good government and much of his speech included praise and support of Senator Richard Russell of Georgia who he said has no superior among those mentioned for President.

Russell has the experience, character and courage to make a good President. Following Hoey's address Senator Russell addressed the assembly as an emissary of the Democratic senators in Washington who that afternoon had heard about the citation to be awarded Hoey and wanted to add one of their own. 49 of them signed a citation of appreciation of Senator Hoey and persuaded Senator Russell to take a plane Wednesday afternoon at 4 o'clock and deliver it in person to Hoey in Raleigh.
