She and her sister, Miss Anne Nash, built the first house in Gillette Woods in 1922 and her garden was one of the show places in Tryon. Miss Nash did newspaper work for many years in both Chicago and New York before coming to Tryon, and was also an artist having studied in Paris under Bougureau. She was one of the early members of the Lanier Club and a charter member of the Tryon Garden Club, in which she was active for many years.
