Mrs. William H. Burtenshaw passed away Friday morning, Oct. 31st. She had been a resident of Tryon for 24 years and was chairman of the Helping Hand for part of that time. She was born in Hartford, Conn., and spent her early married life in Detroit, Mich. She was interested in philanthropies there and was on the Board of Trustees of the Woman's Hospital for 40 years. During the First World War she was active in the Red Cross, helping to equip and send overseas Base Hospital 36.

She is survived by her daughter, Mrs. Alexander Knott; two grandchildren, Alexander Waller Knott and Nancy Waller Knott, and a sister, Mrs. Lewis D. Parker, of Lebanon Center, N. Y.

Her husband died in Tryon in November 1948.
