Total rainfall for 1952, 56.44 inches, a shortage of 4.66 inches . . . Congratulations to the Tryon Federal Savings & Loan Association on its tremendous growth within the past few years. The Association has had a steady growth ever since it was organized, but in 1947 to 1949 the growth increased over \$100,000 per year until 1950 when the growth jumped to nearly \$300,000 and since that time the increase was over a million and a half dollars for a staggering total of \$2,650,547.49.

An interesting statement and some facts about the Association are published elsewhere in this issue which show that 2,000 families were enabled to buy or build homes, and only one instance has it been necessary to foreclose for non-payment of loan. During the past six months 934 investors have shared in the distribution of dividends totaling \$41,000 at the 3½% dividend rate. The Association is directed by C. D. Stevens, president; P. L.
