Tryon Woman Is Winner In Bridge Event

Pinehurst, N. C., Jan. 18—Mrs. W. S. Johnston of Greenville, S. C., and Mrs. Baxter Haynes of Tryon are the new bridge champions of the southeast after their triumph over a record field of 304 players in the annual Mid-Southern Bridge Championship held here.

Mrs. Johnston and Mrs. Haynes, newcomers in the event, led all the way through the two-day tournament which ended late last night. It was the first time in the history of the event that any one pair led all the way through the qualifying sessions and championship playoff finals.

The tournament drew entries from nine states and the District of Columbia and was directed by Mrs. Ann Baker Fenner of Tarboro.

Mrs. Stanislas Czetwertynski (Betty Sturgis) of Tryon won second in consolation.
