COL. A. L. SMITH

Col. Arthur Lewis Smith, 78, died Thursday at 1 p. m., at St. Luke's Hospital. He had been in declining health for several years.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at 3 p. m., at the Congregational Church in Tryon with Rev. Orville H. White officiating. Interment will be at the National Cemetery in Arlington on Monday. Petty Funeral Home in charge of service here.

Col. Smith served as a chaplain in the Spanish-American War and World War I. During World War II he traveled over the U. S. helping to establish Masonic recreation centers for the service men. He had been a part time resident of Tryon for about 45 years, owning Tryon Hills and other property here and operating real estate interests in Washington, D. C. He was a native of Summerfield, N. C.

Surviving are: his wife, Mrs. Marguerite Smith; one daughter, Mrs. F. W. Gravit of Booneville, Ind.; one son, Lewis M. of Arlington, Va.; and two sisters, Mrs. Joseph Ogburn of Sarasota, Fla., and Mrs. John Medearis of Summerfield, N. C.
