John R. (Jack) Kimberly, executive vice-president of the Kimberly-Clark Foundation, Neenah, Wis. and son of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Kimberly of Tryon, has been elected to the board of trustees of the Rockefeller Foundation, New York, according to announcement made at the annual meeting of the board on April 1. At the same time he was elected to membership on the executive committee which directs the expenditure of millions of dollars annually for many philanthropic causes including education, health and the betterment of mankind in general throughout the world.

Mr. Kimberly in addition to being executive officer of one of the largest paper manufacturing companies in the world is also a trustee of Lawrence College, vice-president of International Cellocton Co., president of Berkeley Mills, Balfour, N. C., and has large farming and timber interests including Eskdale Farm at Tryon where he maintains a winter home and stables. He takes an active interest in many civic affairs especially the Riding & Hunt Club.
