Frederic Worth Goddard died suddenly Sunday afternoon, May 3. of a heart attack following a long illness.

Mr. Goddard came to Tryon in 1946. He was born in Plainfield, N. J., son of George H., and Elizabeth Newton Goddard. He graduated from Amherst, class of 1898 of which he was still class president at the time of his death. He was associated with the firm of Johnson & Higgins, Insurance Adjusters for 45 years.

He was an officer in the Essex troop of New Jersey, serving with that organization in the Mexican border war.

In World War I he was with the Blue and Gray division, stationed at Anniston, Ala., where as captain of artillery he became aid to General Rafferty. In France he served as a staff officer with General Holbrook in the Meuse-Argenne engagements.
