During the three years the Tryon schools have had the scholastic accident insurance for students and school personnel, \$2,118.05 has been received in benefits by injured persons who had the insurance, while only \$1,372.50 has been paid to the insurance company in premiums. A student could carry this insurance for 11 years and never receive a penny in benefits but have an accident in the 12th grade and receive back several times the amount of the premiums paid in the previous 11 years.

This insurance will cost \$1.25 per person during the 1953-54 school year, but the blanket medical benefit has doubled since last year's policy from \$1,000 to \$2,000. This means that the insurance will pay in full, up to \$2,000, the medical, hospital and dental expenses for all treatment received during the 12-month period following the accidental injury, if such treatment commences within 60 days following the injury.
