The movie, presented in technicolor, showed the forests with the trees being cut, sawed, hauled, marked, and then floated down streams and lakes to reach the paper mills.

Mr. Jones said that at present three out of every five sheets of newsprint come from Canada, but that in a few years The Asheville Citizen-Times Co., will be able to purchase almost all of their newsprint from Southern paper mills which are now being built in Georgia, Tennessee and Alabama.
