VETERANS NOTICE

The North Carolina Veterans Commission will have a representative, Jack C. Winchester, District Service Officer, with the County Service Officer, Columbus, on Thursday, Dec. 3, from 11 a. m., to 4 p. m. to assist the County Service Officer with various claims.

Mr. Winchester stated that many veterans of the Korean War must enter Education or On-Job Training courses before Aug. 20, 1954, in order to receive these benefits as the law states that Korean veterans must enter training on or before August 20, 1954, or within two years after date of discharge from service, whichever is later. Certain service connected disabled veterans are not bound by this cut-off date as they would train or go to school under a different law.

The service officer also stated that veterans who are interested in and eligible for Direct Veterans Administration Home Loans, either WW II or Korean, have until June 30, 1954, in which to apply.

Vets who have a condition believed to have resulted from service should file application as soon as possible after discharge in order to obtain service connection if possible. Veterans or their dependents should contact the service officer for any assistance on these and other inquiries, Mr. Winchester pointed out.
