New World At Lanier Library



It presents the first pictures of America, of the Indians and animal life, with contemporary narratives. Here are the water colors, in their original color, John White made in 1585, when governor of the colony on Roanoke; here are the paintings by Jacques Le Moyne, who accompanied the French Expedition to Florida, 1564. And here are the De Bry engravings of their work published in his book on the English colony in 1590.

The editor of "The New World," Stefan Lorant, was born in Hungary and came to this country in 1940, after escaping from Hitler. He expresses his love for America and freedom by producing such handsome books as "Lincoln, His Life in Photographs," and "The Presidency: the Historv of Presidential Elections from Washington to Truman."
