## Statewide Soil Survey **Moving Ahead**

North Carolin's cooperative soil survey program reached another milestone recently when the participating federal and state a encies signed a Memorandum of Understanding according to Jesse L. Hicks, State Conservationist for the Soil Conservation Service.

The memorandum is a mutual agreement between the cooperating agencies as they work together to complete soil surveys in each of North Carolina's 100 counties by 1990. It outlines the operating principles, standards, procedures and inputs that each agency will make.

Cooperating agencies are the Soil Conservation Service, N. C. State University, N. C. Agricultural Research Service. N. C. Agricultural Extension Service, N. C. Department of Natural Resources and Community Development, N. C. Soil and Water Conservation Commission and the U.S. Forest Service.

County input is also vital to soil surveys. A separate memorandum of understanding is developed between participating parties and county governments when an individual county soil survey is started.

To date, soil surveys have been published for 20 counties, with field work completed in seven counties that are in the process of being published. Soil mapping is
