VETERAN QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q. I receive a pension from the Veterans Administration. Since I am over 65, I am automatically considered disabled. Does my age mean that I am also exempt from having to report income increases that might affect my pension?

A. No. Your pension is based on the amount of total income you receive and you must report increases. This is true even though you remain under the "old" law and do not receive an income questionaire from VA upon having attained the age of 72.

Q. Can closing costs be included in the amount of money the government guarantees for a GI home loan?

A. No. All such costs must be paid in cash.

Q. I am a GI Bill student in need of some help from a tutor and I understand the Veterans Administration provides such help. Will these extra payments reduce the GI Bill time I have coming to me?

A. No. VA will pay up to \$69 a month for tutoring, to a maximum amount of \$828, with no charge against your basic entitlement to training.

Q. How long after the death of a veteran does a survivor have to

request a burial allowance from the Veteran Administration?

A. The claim must be filed within two years after the veteran's permanent burial or cremation. This may be done at the nearest VA benefits office.

TAX TIP (Employee Business Expenses)

Question: I am a construction worker and spend about \$200 a year on dungarees, work jackets and coveralls. Can I deduct this cost for my work clothes and the expense of cleaning them?

Answer: No. The clothing you describe is ordinary clothing that is adaptable to general wear whether or not you are working. The cost is a personal expense and not deductible. This is true even if your employer requires you to wear this clothing. Only costumes and uniforms that are not suitable for general wear are deductible. — Provided as a Public Service of H&R Block, The Income Tax People.
