Weather Tuesday: high 55, low 23; Wednesday: high 60, low 25. Thursday was sunny and mild, but on the windy side.

Guerrillas shot their way into the Dominican Republic Embassy in Bogata, Colombia, Wednesday, seizing Diego C. Asencio of the U. S. and at least 15 other ambassadors hostage. They demanded \$50 million, release of all political prisoners and safe passage from the country.

George F. Kennan, a Russian scholar who served as ambassador to the Soviet Union in 1952 told the Senate Foreign Relations Committee that putting open pressure on the Soviets to withdraw from Afghanistan is only making it difficult for them to do so.

A unanimous Supreme Court ruled Wednesday that wives and husbands cannot block their spouse from testifying against them in federal court. Prosecutors cannot force spouses to testify against each other, but left the question of testifying up to the potential witness.
