### **SEAMS**

If the underarm sleeve seams and crotch seams always seem to rip out of your children's clothes, reinforce these seams with a second row of machine stitching placed one-eighth inch inside the seam allowance.

Use 12 to 24 stitches per inch. recommend NCSU agricultural extension specialists.

Narrow and crooked seams can also benefit from this same treatment.

Preventive treatments for pockets are also easy to do. Just machine stitch a double row of stitches at the top and sides of each patch pocket.
