

HAND-ME-DOWNS

Hand-me-downs are one way to stretch the family clothing dollar.

However, children are different in the ways they'll accept this type of clothing, say NCSU agricultural extension specialists.

In general, if the child respects and admires the person who first

wore the handed-down clothes, he will accept them and wear them proudly.

But if he feels he is only getting left-overs, he may refuse them, say the specialists.

For some help in "re-doing" clothes as hand-me-downs, call your local county extension home economics agent.

SEAMS

If the underarm sleeve seams and crotch seams always seem to rip out of your children's clothes, reinforce these seams with a second row of machine stitching placed one-eighth inch inside the seam allowance.

Use 12 to 24 stitches per inch, recommend NCSU agricultural extension specialists.

Narrow and crooked seams can also benefit from this same treatment.

Preventive treatments for pockets are also easy to do. Just machine stitch a double row of stitches at the top and sides of each patch pocket.

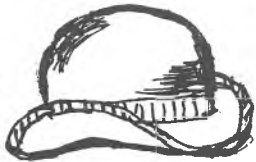
