Expect To Meet New Area Doctors

After illness, death and departure brought the number of physicians here way down last year, 1980 promises to bring more physicians to the area served by St. Luke's Hospital.

Trustees at their March meeting discussed the arrival of physicians planning to locate in Polk County this year, and the Landrum Medical Center's plan for M.D.'s in 1980.

A committee from the Landrum Medical Center, and one from St. Luke's, will meet and discuss the impact of more physicians on the community, the hospital and the doctors.

New doctors planning to come to Polk County this year will rent already existing suitable offices in and near Tryon, according to present plans. Inflation has made it impossible for St. Luke's to augment the Doctors' Building Complex at this time, as was hoped for.

The board voted to admit Dr. (Ph.D.) Vanna Magsino, Clinical Psychologist, to the Consulting Staff of St. Luke's.

An amendment to the hospital charter was passed to do with removal of Trustees from the board. Gist is that any Trustee can be removed by the affirmative vote of ten members. However, a Trustee appointed by the County cannot be removed thusly without request or consent by a majority of the County Commissioners. Vote was unanimous yea with Lawrence Hendra voting nay.

Patient days were way down in February, and are way up in March. No matter how low the census goes, 24 hour staffing must continue at St. Luke's. — Reporter
