"Mouse-to-College" — what's that? is the usual response of newcomers not acquainted with one of the American Cancer Society's most unusual fundraisers. Uniquely designed to appeal to children who want to take part in the nationwide April effort to defeat cancer, "Mouse-to-College" also educates youngsters in the importance of maintaining good health habits, one of the best ways to help protect themselves against disease.

The program begins March 11 under the supervision of Kathryn Potter, a volunteer teacher at Tryon Elementary School, and involves grades 8 down through kindergarten.

After a brief talk on health by Dr. Roy Morgan, Professional Education Chairman of the Polk County Unit of the American Cancer Society, and a film furnished by that organization, the children will be given small envelopes depicting a mouse in diploma grab. "I sent a mouse to college," as shown on the brightly colored buttons worn by the young crusaders means that each is collecting at least 51c to purchase a mouse for research, the major way of putting an end to cancer as a human disease. "Some of our Crusaders will send more than one mouse to college", predicts Mrs. Potter, a retired school teacher who taught for many years in Milwaukee, Wisconsin before moving to Tryon two years ago. "They know the importance of their project and have agreed to crusade for us during the entire week of April 11 — 18". — Reporter
