"Godspell" features Andrew Moller, a former professional singer and musician, in the role of Jesus and Thom Seymour, who has delighted audiences at both The Spartanburg Little Theatre and Arts Center's annual Shakespeare Festival, as Judas. Also in the cast are Rosalind Huffman, a veteran of two national professional theatre tours, and Christopher Cline who appeared two seasons ago in the North Carolina drama, "Unto These Hills." Teri and Sam Smith, who also appear in "Godspell", bring acting experience in Atlanta and Greenville to this production.
