Annual Rabies Clinic To Begin May 5th

County veterinarians, will begin giving rabies vaccinations on Monday, May 5th. This year the Rabies Clinics will run for one week, Monday through Friday.

North Carolina State Law requires owners of every dog four months old and over, to be vaccinated against Rabies at the required intervals. Dogs are required to wear metal tags at all times, otherwise they are subject to being picked up and confined to the county animal shelter.

Watch the dates and locations of clinics.

The county animal control officer will be canvassing the county to enforce the required immunization laws.
