Problems involving visitors to the Green River in the Green River Cove area in Polk County and potential solutions of these problems will be explained to Rotarians gathering at 12:45 Friday at the Dinner Bell for a luncheon meeting.

The speaker will be Mickey Lewis, Program Coordinator for the Isothermal Planning Commission, and a graduate of North Carolina State University with a major in Forestry.

Whether or not a part of the Green River between 1-26 and Lake Adger should become a part of the State National and Scenic River System is a current issue. In the summer thousands of picnickers and campers come to this section of the river and the cove. Some of the visitors ignore the rights of landowners and violate ecological standards, Mr. Lewis and local members of the River Advisory Committee have been studying the problems arising from the conduct of the visitors. He will catalogue the problems for the Rotarians and list possible actions to be taken to permit full enjoyment of the locality without undersirable consequences.
