## **Bob Jones**. III To Speak At Grace BAptist Ch.

Dr. Bob Jones, III, president of Bob Jones University in Greenville, S. C., will speak at Grace Baptist Church, Landrum, S. C., on May 4th at 7:00 p.m.

Dr. Jones is the third president of the "World's Most Unusual University", founded by his late grandfather in 1927. Under the leadership of the three Drs. One of America's youngest college chief executives, Dr. Jones became president of BJU in 1971.
