

Thompson Appointed Joint Master

Earl Thompson of Columbus was appointed Joint Master of Foxhounds of the Tryon Hounds by the Hunt's Board of Directors at its annual meeting on April 27. He will serve with Mrs. George Hughston, Jr., MFH since 1975.

Arthur Farwell was named a lifetime honorary member of the board upon his resignation from the nine-member governing body of the corporation. Since 1952 Mr. Farwell has been Master or Joint Master for a total of 14 years, and has served on the board.

The new chairman of the board is Mrs. Walter Lehner of Tryon. Thompson was re-elected to the presidency, and George Webster of Landrum was elected vice-president. Mrs. Frank G. Austell, III, of Spartanburg is the new secretary, and Mrs. Fred Farwell continues as treasurer.

Board members re-elected by the Hunt last Sunday are Mrs. Farwell, Mrs. Hughston, Thompson, Webster, Mrs. Acker, and Mrs. Lehner. New members are Mrs. Austell and David Milne, and Mrs. Miriam G. Rabb of Tryon.

In a report on the 1979-1980 hunting season which ended March 29, Mrs. Hughston told the Hunt members that hounds had been out 41 times during the past season and that hunting had been generally very good, with good cooperation from landowners and plenty of native red or gray foxes. Joint meets have been held with Shakerag of Atlanta, Greenville County, and Yadkin Valley. Mrs. Hughston said hounds are now being readied for the Carolinas Hound Show at Southern Pines May 17. The Tryon Hounds brought home the championship and reserve championship, and numerous other wins from this show last year.

The Tryon Hounds will resume foxhunting in October, with the formal opening meet on Thanksgiving Day. In the meantime, there will be numerous work days for the property and trails and for training hounds. The first day is May 31 at the club house. — Reporter
