

## Good Start For Youth Gardens

Tryon Youth Gardens has made an excellent start this spring, it was announced at a meeting Thursday of the Youth Gardens Council of the Carolinas at the home of the Chairman, Mrs. Edward W. Russell.

Ground has been prepared and staked out at the Tryon High School and already nearly thirty children have asked to participate, reported Joseph P. Wray, Advisor to the Council.

Douglas Roach, of the Agricultural Extension Service, is giving the children an introduction to gardening and is helping them to plan their gardens, said Mr. Wray and Lewis C. Wrenshall has agreed to give some gardening demonstrations in the field.

Second graders have already announced their determination to establish a patch of Irish potatoes; and parent participation in the gardens has been encouraged by "gardening agreements" signed by both parents and children.

Mr. Wray reported a new development: several requests for family plots have already been received; and a few more family garden spots measuring fifteen by twenty feet are still available on a first-come first-served basis. These plots are in demand by families whose yards are too small or too shaded to grow worthwhile vegetables.
