A federal judge Tuesday overturned President Carter's 10-cent-a-gallon gasoline fee that was to have shown up at gasoline pumps Thursday. Carter's fee would be imposed on all gasoline, whether it was refined from domestic or imported oil, while the law only gives the president the power to regulate imported gasoline and crude oil, U. S. District Judge Aubrey E. Robinson, Jr. said. The government will appeal.

## Water Bills To Increase In Landrum
