Man Charged In Traffic Death Of Woman

A Spartanburg man has been charged with reckless homicide-involuntary manslaughter in the April 12 traffic death of a Landrum area woman.

John Floyd Caldwell, 30, of 249 W. Wood St., was charged in a warrant signed by Highway Patrolman Ray Coker. A coroner's jury Tuesday recommended that Caldwell be held for further investigation.

Cathy Jackson, 22, of Landrum Route 1, died in a two-car accident at New Cut Road and Secondary Road 41 near the KOA Campground. Mrs. Jackson was a passenger in a van being driven east on New Cut Road by her husband, Thurston, 23. The van collided in the intersection with a Pontiac being driven by Caldwell, according to Coker. — Spartanburg Herald
