Museum Notes

"Museum Notes" reports that Philip Dusenbury's sculpture will go on view at the Greenville County Museum of Art beginning Sunday, July 13 and remain until Sunday, August 31st.

"Described as images of life's "other side," Dusenbury's figures will remain on display through August 31st.

"A piece of sculpture by Dusenbury is never blase whether it is depicting humor, compassion, horror or whimsy. His work always brings into fucus a delicate balance of feelings.

"Dusenbury, a resident of Rt. 1, Saluda, N. C. started sculpting with clay while serving a stint in the Army near Yuma, Arizona. He later shifted to papier-mache because newspapers were inexpensive and readily available.

"Presently, Dusenbury's work is undergoing a metamorphosis. While once limiting his work to small comical papier-mache figures, Dusenbury now works with plaster cloth fashioning intimidating life-sized objects. All of Dusenbury's work is coated with a polymer resin for durability. The coating used is very similar to those applied to Chinese lacquered boxes.

"Dusenbury's work has been exhibited at the Gibbes Art Gallery, Charleston, S. C.; Ackland Gallery, Chapel Hill, and the Peachtree Gallery in Atlanta, Ga."
