U. S. Labor Secretary Ray Marshall said Wednesday in Washington that the nation's unemployment rate could peak at 8.5 percent by early next year.

Two days of riots have left up to 42 people dead and 200 injured in a mixed-race township near Cape Town, South Africa.

A federal grand jury on Wednesday indicted two House committee chairmen, the fourth and fifth congressmen charged in the FBI's undercover Abscam investigation. The indictment charges Frank Thompson of New Jersey and John Murphy of New York with conspiracy, bribery, illegally receiving compensation for services relating to government matters and abetting in interstate travel in aid of racketeering enterprise.

The Equal Right Amendment came up five votes short in the Illinois House on Wednesday.
