Town Of Landrum Buys Computer

The Landrum City Council met Tuesday night at the City Hall.

The Council negotiated a loan with the Farmers Home Administration for \$1,250,000 to refinance a water and sewer loan, which the town took out in 1974 for installation of the water and sewer system.

The first reading was passed on a new business fee for telephone companies which was set at 1 percent on gross receipts within the city limits.

The Council approved N. Paul Skelton, CPA for the annual audit.

Council voted to buy the Radio Shack Computer at \$8,661.12, paying one-third on delivery and balance by Nov. 1st.

Councilman Calvin Whiteside reported the bad situation of people living outside the city limits using the dumpsters to put their garbage in. The Council instructed the police to prosecute those using the dumpsters who do not live inside the city limits.

The Council approved requests for water bill adjustments.

Due to complaints of excess noise and disturbance, the Council set a 10 p.m. curfew at Brookwood Park. All people must be out of the park by 10 p.m. or face prosecution.
