Dr. Charles E. Edwards will be the guest speaker at the Sandy Plains ARP Church beginning Sunday, Sept. 7 thru Thurs., Sept. 11. The Sunday services will be at 11 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. On Monday through Thursday, Dr. Edwards will lead a morning Bible Study at 10 a.m. and an evening workshop service at 7 p.m. The Bible Study will be on the book of James.

Doctor Edwards received ordination at the Bethel ARP Church in Vidette, Ga. in 1932. Two years later he graduated from Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, N. J. with a Masters of Theology Degree. In 1952 he received his honorary Doctorate from Erskine Theological Seminary in Due West, S. C. He has served three churches including the Boyce Memorial ARP Church in Kings Mountain, N. C. He also served as a Chaplain in the U. S. Army during World War II.

The pastor, Rev. Wm. A. Robfogal said that Dr. Edwards is one of the most sought after ministers in the ARP Church to hold special services since he retired from the active pastorate in 1978. He is married to Dorothy Ringhausen Edwards and has two children and seven grandchildren.
