The Iran-Iraq border feud is turning into a full scale war.

North Carolina's unemployment rate fell by more than a percentage point to 7 percent last month as the number of jobs in the furniture, textile and apparel industries rose.

Fears of a full-scale war between Iran and Iraq sent gold prices soaring past the \$700 an ounce mark Monday for the first time in seven months.
