He is a crewmember aboard the aircraft carrier USS Saratoga, homeported in Mayport, Fla.

During the cruise, the crew had the opportunity to visit the ports of Rota, Malaga and Palma de Mallorca, Spain; Naples, Italy and Tunis, Tunisia. The ship participated in several training exercises, including the NATO exercise "Dawn Patrol". "Dawn Patrol" tested the ship's ability to record ship movement and tracked the ship through a myriad of submarine, aircraft and surface ship threats.

The Saratoga celebrated its 24th birthday during this cruise. In October, the ship will commence a 28-month overhaul in Philadelphia.
