Lorena Cloninger Durham, the 1974 South Carolina Mother of the Year, of Landrum died at the Kings Mountain Hospital in Kings Mountain on Oct. 13th. Mrs. Durham was the widow of Wood Krider Durham, peach orchardist and postmaster of Landrum. She was the daughter of the late Thomas and Minnie Sigmon Cloniger of Claremont, N.C. After being educated at Startown Academy, Startown, N. C. and Lenoir Rhyne College, she taught school in Claremont.

After her marriage and moving to Landrum, Mrs. Durham was involved in the development and management of the family orchards. At her husband's death she was appointed postmaster of Landrum and later served as head teller in the Landrum Branch of the First National
