Body Found In Green River Cove

Two squirrel hunters discovered a body in Green River Cove Thursday afternoon about 2:30 p.m. Polk County Sheriff Boyce Carswell said that the body believed to be that of a white male, had been dead for several months.

The body was found in a small creek about 200 ft. off the Green River Cove Road just before you start up the mountain toward Saluda. The remains wore jockey shorts, but Sheriff Carswell said that a pair of pants and shirt was found near by, but no identification.

The body was taken to Chapel Hill for an autopsy to see if the cause of death could be determined and to see if identification could be made.
