He has been featured in Music Foundation Operas and Pops Concerts and has also appeared with the Spartanburg Auditorum's annual Festival of Christmas Music. He starred, together with Janice Janiec, in the Spartanburg Little Theatre's popular production of "I Do, I Do," and his latest starring role was in this year's hit production of "Gigi".

Frank Dillard is no stranger in this area having done solo work numerous occasions with the Congregational Church Choir in Tryon.

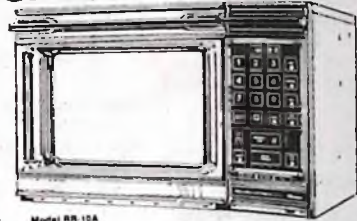
