## Eye Emergencies

You could become a victim of a potentially blinding eye injury.

If an accident occurs, says the National Society to Prevent Blindness, you should know what to do.



If household chemicals or battery acids come in contact with the eyes, immediately flush with water and continue for at least 15 minutes, holding the eyelids open. Then seek medical attention without delay.

Should specks get into the eye, lift the upper eyelid outward and down over the lower lid and let tears wash out the foreign particles. If they do not wash out, keep the eye closed, bandaged lightly and see a doctor. Never rub the eye.
