specialist)

Q. I plan to get some leaves from the City of Raleigh this fall to add to my vegetable garden soil. How deep should I spread the leaves over the garden area? (R. S., Raleigh)

A. Four to six inches of unshredded leaves should be sufficient. Wet the leaves and turn them into the soil as quickly as possible. Apply one pound of ammonium nitrate or equivalent (33 percent actual nitrogen) per 100 square feet to keep the decay organisms actively growing. Incidentally, one cubic yard of leaves will cover 100 square feet to a depth of six inches. Leaf collecting trucks used by the City of Raleigh hold about 20 cubic yards. (Larry Bass, extension horticultural specialist)
