under the direction of Joe Erwin. This year's performance will be at the Fine Arts Center on Saturday, Dec. 13 at 8 p.m. and Sunday, Dec. 14th at 3 p.m.

Proceeds of the concert will go to the Rotary International Scholarship Fund which covers five categories of scholarships.

Since these productions began in 1973 under the inspiration and leadership of the late Ken Lackey, aided by Tom Grenfell, the Chorus has grown in size, effectiveness and expertise, due to the dedication of friends in the Tryon area.

The death of Ken Lackey was most difficult for the Chorus, but the void was filled by Ken Smith, Bill Clark and Anton Cedervall, so "The Show Went On." After 1976 Joe Erwin and Inky Cloud were co-conductors, followed by Mary Ann Kilver and lately Joe Erwin.

The large variety of scholarships open many opportunities for qualified applicants. The classifications are: Graduate Fellowships, Undergraduate Scholarships, Technical Training Awards, Teachers of Handicapped Awards — special grants including journalism and group study exchange awards.

The Tryon area has been fortunate to have so many successful candidates. Among graduate fellowships for study abroad there have been Margaret McFarland Clark, New Zealand; Beth Hooker McCallister, France; Ellen Douglas, Germany; Judy Milner, England. All of the above spent one year in the countries noted after competitive exams. Also from this area under Group Study Exchange Awards, Harold Burrell spent some time in Australia and Mayor Ken Tucker recently returned from five weeks in Korea. Such teams consist of a leader, a Rotarian, and four or five young business or professional men 25 to 35 years old.

Since 1976 when the Chorus incorporated and became an independent group, direct management by Rotary ended. However, Tryon Rotary still underwrites the financial requirements of The Chorus. As a result Dr. Wray Monroe, former President of Tryon Rotary and Paul Harris Fellow (Rotary's Highest Award), has acted as liaison between the Chorus and the Club. — Reporter
